CLASSROOM NEWS



Class 3

Class 3 have loved our story this half term, 'The journey home from Grandpas' by Jemima Lumley, we enjoyed playing with the cars and garages, train tracks and we even had a car wash! We used vehicles to drive through paint making lots of patterns, we practised using a pincer grip to colour in tractors, hot air balloons, buses. We even had a go at making and flying paper airplanes. In maths we have been learning about position so putting things 'on', 'in', 'out' and 'under' singing our own 'in and out' song to park up the vehicles. We especially enjoyed our counting lessons looking at trains and counting cars as they sped down ramps.

In PSHE we have been looking at how we are all so different, we have different hair colour, different skin colour etc but we learnt that we all special in different ways.

Sculpture has been our topic in art, so we have been exploring and manipulating clay, learning different ways to use clay, using different tools, adding different textures and then made some amazing clay vehicles.

We have loved music this term, listening to different rock songs, using choosing boards to select instruments and making LOTS of noise too. We have also enjoyed our RE topic learning all about the celebration of Ramadan, we gave money to the poor, helped the community by washing the dishes, tried lots of different food, watched fireworks and listened to the call to prayer. Our favourite lesson was when we did some Mehdi patterns on our hands. We really have been busy; PE with Paul, weekly visits to the Children's centre and our very special Coronation celebration with a street party and parade. Have a lovely half term!







Class 12

Class 12 have had a very busy half term. Our class works in two different groups to best fit the needs of the pupils. Our first group has been raising tadpoles this half term! We have loved setting up their habitat, taking care of them and recording the changes as they grow in our Science lessons. We have also carried this topic on as we used Colourful Semantics to write about the frog life cycle in English, used frogs to work on numbers in real life scenarios in Maths and we have practiced our Art & DT skills through drawing and modelling activities. In addition, we have been working towards completing our ASDAN Towards Independence qualification.

Our second group is preparing to leave Hillside and has had a busy half term of Functional Skills exams. Pupils have sat Level 2 exams in ICT, Speaking & Listening, and Maths. We have been so impressed with the pupils' determination and focus during this busy time. We are certain all of your hard work will pay off when the final results come through. In addition to exams, pupils have been participating in work experience placements at Royal Preston Hospital and onsite with our Site Supervisors. Finally, we have been on trips to the Manchester Museum, Chetham Library and Wild Discovery animal park, all of which go towards our ASDAN PDP Gold qualification.



Class 4

Class 4 have had a busy and exciting half term!! Following the engagement model, we have explored lots of sensory toys, made requests using either petri dishes, Photo symbols or sentence strips. We have also been learning how to say 'more' in Makaton. Everyone seems to want to ask for more of the big fan!!

Amazing achievement!


We have been looking at different jobs in our community and thinking about what people do in these roles. We have also shared what we might want to do when we are older.

Class 1

Our topic this half term has been 'In the Jungle'. In our Literacy lessons we have been reading the book 'Rumble in the Jungle the children have enjoyed meeting different wild animals as we journeyed through the jungle! In Maths we have been learning about money. We sang '5 currant buns in a baker's shop' and exchanged pennies for real cakes and buns! We have had fun exploring shopping role play; buying fruit and veg and ice creams at the ice cream stall. We have enjoyed our new dough disco session, 'Down in the Jungle' and have been learning a range of songs on the jungle theme in our daily music and movement sessions.

In the afternoons we have created artwork on the jungle theme, including paper plate snakes, lion masks, butterfly prints and handprint monkeys. With regard to sensory exploration, we have enjoyed water play whilst washing muddy swamp animals, mooched in swamp play with jungle animals in chocolate angel delight and explored dried peas/frozen peas jungle play! In PE sessions we have been enjoying our songs from the Carnival of the Animals by Saint Sans as part of our warm up. We have been practising freezing when the music stops and moving again when the music plays.

Class 9

Our semi-formal curriculum theme this half term has been Festivals around the World. In English, we have read the story "Rameena's Ramadan". Through this text, we have explored the Islamic festivals of Ramadan and Eid.

The pupils enjoyed celebrating the Coronation of King Charles by joining in with the whole school parade and afternoon tea party.

The focus for our Maths lessons has been money. We have been learning to sort coins, identify the value of different coins and combine coins to make different amounts. We have generalised our learning to practical situations when visiting the tuck shop and during educational visits to Aldi and Sainsburys supermarkets.

In PE lessons, we have played different games. Pupils have also accessed running club each week and we have continued to take part in regular walks around the school grounds.

In RE lessons, we have looked at different features found inside a church

As part of their Asdan award, Key Stage 4 pupils have been involved in choosing a class pet – a hamster which they have named Jilly. The pupils are going to help to look after Jilly

during the next few weeks.
