We all enjoyed watching them grow bigger and stronger.


They loved playing in hay with the guinea pigs.

The ducklings loved swimming.


The feathers on ducklings and ducks are covered in an oily substance that makes them waterproof. The water rolled off the ducklings.






Our ducklings  
delighted everyone.








We learnt about life cycles

furry.


Guinea pigs like to hide

warm places.




They eat hay, cereals,

## Amazing guinea pig facts


Their teeth are constantly growing so it's important for them to chew to wear them down.

It's important to know how to care for pets!




# Cooking

Spring pictures.


We had lots of fun in the adventure playground and mud kitchen.
