EYFS Creative Curriculum

There are seven areas of learning and development that must shape educational programmes in early years settings. All areas of learning and development are important and interconnected and will be taught throughout each topic.

Effective teaching and learning in the EYFS is characterised by playing and exploring - children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'; active learning - children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements; and creating and thinking critically - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.
